PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year!

While January marks the beginning of 2020, two events took place on the final school days of 2019 that I would like to highlight. On December 19th, all students on campus participated in "Give Before You Get." Students were involved in close to 20 different community service projects that included field trips to a retirement home to sing, going to IRE to read to elementary students, and to Stepping Stones Outreach to deliver care packages. Students also stayed on campus and assembled care packages for other community organizations using donations that were collected, or wrote cards for first responders and children staying in hospitals. It was a great success. On December 20th, our leadership class presented us with a Winter Wishes Assembly that was then followed by many of our students getting gifts that their peers wished for them. Every new student received a gift and each student receives at least one gift over the course of their four years at MHS. To make everything come together this year, \$11,000 in cash and in-kind donations were accepted. Thank you to everyone who donated.

With the end of first semester upon us that means the beginning of second semester starts next Monday. It is a new start and a great time for students to make sure they are taking advantage of supports at school like T3 and TLC (our after-school tutorial support in the library). It is also a great opportunity for parent/guardians to sit down with their student, look over final grades and develop both a plan for second semester and strategies to successfully meet the goals of that plan. Part of that plan should include choosing where to go for T3 on tutorial days. 

REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS THROUGH PARCHMENT

Meridian High School has partnered with parchment.com to fulfill transcript requests for current students and MHS alumni. Transcripts are securely sent electronically to colleges and universities across the nation, resulting in a reduction of lost documents at the programs. The service is free of charge to current students. Alumni pay a small fee. Please make sure that your intended college accepts electronic transcripts.

Please find the "Order Records" button located on the bottom of the MHS website. Current students may come to Mrs. Brinkman or Mrs. Waterman to receive their Parchment access code. Codes will given to the class of 2020 seniors soon.

SENIORS

By this time, all students should have their senior presentation worksheet checked off by their adviser. When the worksheet is approved, the PowerPoint may be started. One-half (approx. 8 slides) of the PowerPoint presentation needs to be shown to the adviser by **February 7th**. Practice presentations are the week of March 23rd and a successful practice is mandatory before presentation day. It may take more than one practice to be ready, and the absolute last day to pass your practice is April 17th. No exceptions. Remember, a successful senior presentation is <u>required</u> for graduation!

The senior luncheon and final presentations are **Thursday**, **April 23rd at noon** (an early release day). Our time will begin with a catered lunch followed by presentations in small groups. Please make sure your student blocks out this time, especially if they are involved in Running Start.
