



English 11 Bridge to College English Prep (Yearlong)

Grade 11

Prereq: ILA 9 and 10

Credit: English

The course curriculum emphasizes focused reading, writing, speaking & listening, and research work based on Washington State's K-12 Learning Standards for English language arts (the Common Core State Standards, CCSS- ELA). This course will develop students' college and career readiness by building skills in critical reading, academic writing, speaking and listening, research and inquiry, and language use as defined by the CCSS-ELA for high school. The course will also develop essential habits of mind necessary for student success in college, including independence, productive persistence, and metacognition.

Advanced Placement English Language & Composition (Yearlong)

Grades 11-12

Prereq: ILA 9 and

Advanced Placement English Language and Composition is a class that gives high school students the opportunity to receive advanced placement and/or college credit through passing the AP exam in May of each year. The curriculum level of this class is comparable to an introductory college course. Students who choose AP English Language and Composition should be interested in studying and writing various kinds of analytic or persuasive prose on primarily nonliterary topics. In short, the goal of the class is to develop our skills as effective writers through a study of style and effective techniques, as well as reading critically how other authors and writers develop their craft. 
